To purchase new PE equipment – available for activities, clubs and suitable to deliver the PE curriculum.	Replace old equipment that is no longer fit for purpose. <b>New equipment was purchased mostly at the beginning of the school year to replace old equipment which was no longer suitable, or to extend the amount of resources that could be used by children within lesson time. New hockey sticks were also purchased in the Spring term to aid with lessons and competitions. New hall floor quotes were obtained and one company was asked to complete the job- this has been diaried in, but not yet completed.</b>

<b>Sportsafe came to school to check that both indoor and outdoor equipment were safe to use. The outdoor climbing frame was repaired during the year.</b>

<b>We renewed our memberships with Sainsbury's School Games and with East Bergholt High School Sport – competing in 24 competitions and festivals over the academic year. 94.6% (53/56) of KS2 children participated in at least one inter competition or festival over the year. 100% of KS2 children competed in an Intra-House Dodgeball competition later in the year.</b>				
To provide Professional Development opportunities for Teachers/TA's/Support Staff throughout the school. 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<p>No external courses were attended by staff this academic year, although two staff started their own after school sports club related to their training in the previous year (Netball and Gymnastics). A professional tennis coach and a street dancer came into school to run taster sessions for the children; staff could also attend to develop their understanding for when their delivered their own PE lessons. 3x staff accompanied the children at PGL, providing them with some greater knowledge and ideas when delivering OAA sessions.</p>				
To increase numbers of children participating in competitive opportunities.	To hire a minibus from EBHS for every event which allows for larger groups to enter. To track participation. <p>A minibus was hired from EBHS each time it was available when we required it for travel to and from festivals and competitions. This enabled us to transport a greater number of children to events, allowing them an opportunity to compete against other schools. A coach was also hired for the Cross-Country event at RHS, allowing us to take 25 children.</p>				
To increase capacity of PE and Sport for all pupils at SSMP.	To organise competition teams, permission forms and to have a better understanding of children’s abilities in PE prior to events. <p>Teacher was released to accompany the children to the competition and tournaments and time was also allocated for planning and preparation. 2 members of staff ran a gymnastics club and netball club in preparation for tournaments and festivals.</p>				
To promote the importance of exercise and healthy living.	To begin the Daily Mile, where children spend 15mins jogging or running each day. For the Sports Council to organise and run lunchtime activities for KS1 and KS2. To recognise and display sporting achievements.	Extended opportunities for children to engage in regular physical activity everyday. Sports leaders becoming role models and taking responsibility to help other pupils. <p>The Sports Council met and organised a dodgeball and then a capture the flag lunchtime club in second half of the academic year, splitting them into key stages over different days, allowing all children to participate if they wished. These clubs were set up, run and officiated by sports leaders, who wore sports leader bibs and took the register for children who wished to take part. Sporting achievements are recognised in assemblies and also displayed in the hall for the duration of the year.</p>
