<u>What I should already know</u>: I know how to ask and answer basic questions about myself e.g. name, age, where I live. I can use the grammatical structures 'je suis' and 'je fais'. I know some vocabulary for food and drinks and can order in a cafe, using 'je voudrais.' I know vocabulary for common pets and can use 'j'ai' and 'je n'ai pas" to talk about my pets. I can also use these constructions to talk about the members of my family. I can talk about the weather in French. I know the French words for common items in the classroom and can name some sports from the Olympics in French.
