Can we EXPLORE Christian beliefs about the meaning of the cross in: Biblical Narrative, Church practice and Christian living?

Key vocabulary

Ashamed: embarrassed or guilty because of one's actions.

Atonement:reparation for a wrong or injury

Belief:trust, faith, or confidence in someone or something

Christian:a person who has received Christian baptism or is a believer in Christianity.

Commitment: being dedicated to a cause or activity.

Consequence:a result or effect of an action

Crucifix:a representation of a cross with a figure of Jesus Christ on it

Crucifixion:the execution of a person by nailing or binding them to a cross

Disciples:personal follower of Jesus during his life,

Easter:The most important and oldest festival of the Christian Church,

Incarnation:one of a series of lifetimes that a person spends on earth.

Jesus: 'he saves' or 'saving one' objects or the lives of animals to a higher of propitiation or worship purpose, usually a divine being, as an act

Love: an intense feeling of deep affection

Rescue: To save somebody

Resurrection: 'being raised in new life'

Sacrifice:an act of giving up something valued for the sake of something else regarded as more important or worthy. Some religions sacrifice an

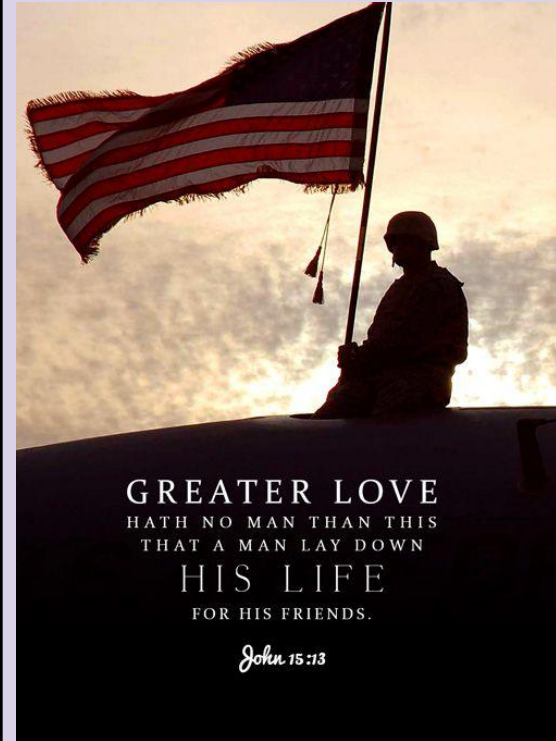
Sin:an immoral act
