One leg : in a point and the other holds a pencil. - a mark made on a surface that joins different points. Lines can vary in length, th, direction and shape - k-making - Describes the different lines, dots, marks, patterns, and textures we te in artwork. if - A distinct formal unit that may repeat in an artwork. tern - Repeated motifs in art.
