**Christianity:**

**What I should already know?:** Children have learnt about different religions and beliefs and have learnt the importance of repentance and treating others well. Children have learnt about the ten commandments in Christianity. Children have looked at the five pillars of Islam. Children have learnt about how Muslims show submission and obedience to Allah as well as considering their own beliefs. Children have learnt about the importance of Karma in Hinduism. Children have learnt the Easter story last year in Christianity and how it is important to Christians. Children have thought about the symbol of the cross and how it is an important symbol as well as thinking about how The Cross is a symbol love, sacrifice and commitment.

**Key vocabulary**

**Anointed one:** 'Christ' in Greek. Equivalent to King.

**Banished:** send someone away from a country or place as an official punishment

**Belief:** trust, faith, or confidence in someone or something

**Charity:** the voluntary giving of help, typically in the form of money, to those in need.

**Christ:** 'Anointed one'

**Christian:** a person who has received Christian baptism or is a believer in Christianity.

**Commandments:** Religious rules

**Commitment:** being dedicated to a cause or activity.

**Consequence:** a result or effect of an action

**Crucifix:** a representation of a cross with a figure of Jesus Christ on it

**Crucifixion:** the execution of a person by nailing or binding them to a cross

**Disciples:** personal follower of Jesus during his life,.

**Injustice:** Lack of fairness or justice.

**Jesus:** 'he saves' or 'saving one'

**Justice:** Just behaviour or treatment- fairness.

**Kingdom of God:** A place where God rules, out of this world- not an earthly country with borders which is an ideal place- fair, just- like heaven.

**Kingdom Values:** A way of life which emerges from Jesus' teaching of the Kingdom of God.

**Kingdom:** A country, state or territory ruled by a King or Queen.

**R.E Skills:**

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**Lord's Prayer:** A well known Christian prayer.

**Love:** an intense feeling of deep affection

**Messiah:** The leader or 'saviour'. Hebrew for 'Christ'.

**Miracles:** a surprising and welcome event that is not explicable by natural or scientific laws and is therefore considered to be the work of a divine agency.

**Palm Sunday:** the Sunday before Easter, when the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem is celebrated

**Parables:** Religious stories to teach Christian life lessons and morals.

**Prayer:** To pray.

**Prophets:** a person regarded as an inspired teacher or proclaimer of the will of God

**Repent:** feel or express sincere regret or remorse about one's wrongdoing or sin

**Rescue:** To save somebody

**Resurrection:** 'being raised in new life'

**Righteousness:** The quality of being morally right or justifiable.

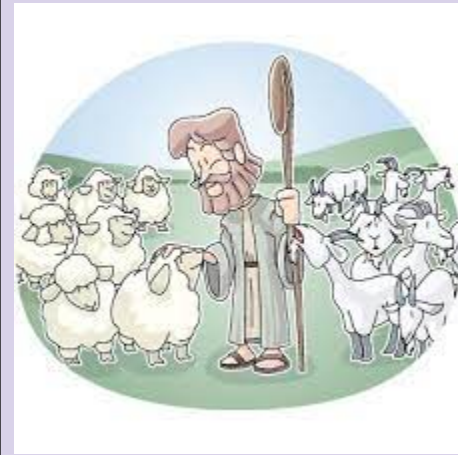
**Sacrifice:** an act of giving up something valued for the sake of something else regarded as more important or worthy. Some religions sacrifice an animal to their God/s to show commitment to their religion.

**Sin:** an immoral act

**Submit:** accept or yield to a superior force or to the authority or will of another person

**Symbol:** a thing that represents or stands for something else, a thing offered, especially as a gift or contribution.: "animals as sacrificial Offerings". the lives of animals to a higher of propitiation or worship purpose, usually a divine being, as an act.
