<ul> <li>Enquiry Questions</li> <li>What is a search engine and how do we use one?</li> <li>Is everything we see online true?</li> <li>How can we search effectively on the internet?</li> <li>Can we create an informative poster?</li> <li>How do search engines work?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Key Vocabulary</li> <li>Algorithm – A sequence of instructions which, when followed, solve a problem.</li> <li>Company logo – A symbol or motif, used to represent an organisation, so that it can be identified quickly and easily in a busy environment online or in the real world.</li> <li>Data leak – When information is released without approval from the owner or creator.</li> <li>Data privacy – The right to keep information private and away from those you do not wish to have access.</li> <li>Fake news – False and inaccurate information that is shared in a convincing way, usually on social media and in websites.</li> <li>Inaccurate information – When information about previously searched results, to make this quicker next time they are accessed.</li> <li>Keywords (internet) – A set of words used to define and produce an accurate search engine result.</li> <li>Network – When more than one electronic device is connected in a network through the internet or a local connection in order to share files and information.</li> <li>Online – When a person is accessing the internet through an electronic device.</li> <li>Page rank – Web pages are sorted in order to give the user the most suitable results at the top of the list. The first result could be considered rank one.</li> <li>Search engine – A way for a user to search the internet's database of information.</li> <li>TASK – Title, Author, Summary, Kids.</li> <li>Web strawter – A program that uses keywords to search the WWW in a logical and systematic way to find the most suitable results for the user.</li> <li>Website – A series of web pages and other content, which can be discovered and read through an internet browser, that all belong to a single domain name. For example, Google. The main place where particular web pages can be viewed or accessed.</li> <li>WWW – The acronym used to express the 'World Wide Web'.
