Instructions - are sets of information that teach you how to do something or use something.

Interrupt - to speak while others are speaking

Map is a drawing of all or part of Earth's surface. Its basic purpose is to show where things are. Maps may show visible features, such as rivers and lakes, forests, buildings, and roads. They may also show things that cannot be seen, such as boundaries and temperatures. Most maps are drawn on a flat surface.

Teamwork working with others to succeed

*OAA stands for Outdoor Adventurous Activities. These activities can be land based e.g. rock climbing, abseiling, orienteering, they can be water based e.g. kayaking, surfing, sailing or air based e.g. parachuting or paragliding. All of these activities require problem solving, collaboration, decision making and teamwork skills.*

Working with integrity

*means following the rules even when no-one else is watching. By having good integrity, we gain trust from others, learn to be dependable and form positive relationships.*
