What I should already know: The children will know some similarities and differences between different religious and cultural communities in this country, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.

# What I should know by the end of the topic

- Can we say what story has taught us something?
- Do we know which of Jesus' parables is our favourite and why?
- Do we know what Jesus taught about God in his parables?
- Do we know why Christian keep on telling Jesus' parables?

#### Key Vocabulary

**bible** - Special book that tells Christians about God's love.

christian - people who believe that Jesus was the son of God. They practise Christianity. disciples - one who follows a leader or teacher God - a being that is worshiped and believed to have special powers over nature or lifes. gospel - good news.

Jesus - the teacher and prophet who founded the Christian faith. He is considered by Christians to be the son of God and the Christ or saviour.

parables - a very short story told to teach a moral or religious lesson.

prayer - words spoken to God
