
Knowledge Organiser: Spring 1 All About Us



Literacy: Reading Phonics

Oral blending - this is when you blend the sounds together to say the word (cat). We use a blending finger motion from left to right to help blend the sounds together.

Oral Segmenting – this is when you split a word up into its individual sounds (c-a-t).
We call this 'robot talk'.

"Look at the letter, make the sounds and blend the sounds together" Using our phonics to help us read:

Blend and segment known sounds for reading and spelling VC, CVC, CVCC.

VC words: at, it.

CVC words: mum, dog, pin, sat. CVCC words: milk, hump, sand.

See the word, say the word! (sight words).

Recapping and consolidate all Phase 2 sounds

Digraph: two letters that make one sound.

Number Bonds

A_number bond is a simple addition sum which has become so familiar that a chid can recognise it and complete it almost instantly.

Using a 10 frame for counting, counting on and addition.


One to one correspondence -

Write from left to right and top to bottom. Begin to form recognisable letters.
